General Overview	On the doorstep of Yellowstone National Park, in the vibrant town of Jackson, Wyoming, Anvil Hotel celebrates the wonder of place. Originally constructed in the 1950s, Anvil Hotel is a modern interpretation of the classic Western lodge. The mountain-rustic hotel features 51 well-appointed rooms, while the lobby merges the features of a café and mercantile store to create a welcoming setting with cozy seating, a wood-burning stove, and a curated shop. Here, guests can enjoy complimentary custom blended coffee from Jackson's Snake River Roasters. Glorietta, an Italian trattoria featuring a seasonally rotating menu of handmade pasta, woodfired dishes and exceptional beverage programming is just a short walk away. A director of experiences and guest culture also provides a variety of thoughtfully curated recreational activities for guests to enjoy, many of which are available at the nearby Turpin Meadow Ranch.

Dining Guests staying at Anvil Hotel have convenient access to Glorietta, a modern rustic Italian trattoria offering wood-fired Italian cuisine, an award-winning beverage program featuring craft cocktails and a value-oriented wine list. Additionally, guests can enjoy a gourmet, chef-crafted breakfast at the nearby Alpine House daily from 7-10 a.m. for \$25 per person.

- Design Designed by Brooklyn-based Studio Tack, Anvil Hotel unites historical touches with contemporary design, emphasizing warm wood tones with detailing paneling and brass fixtures throughout the rooms and common areas. Each room is outfitted with custom metal beds crafted in collaboration with Charles P. Rogers, custom Woolrich blankets, custom benches and side tables by Tretiak Works and Hedge House, Kilim rugs and lighting designed by Allied Maker. The bathrooms showcase raw brass fixtures, overhead rain showers by Waterworks and bath products from Co. Bigelow.
- Location Jackson is the West's famous gateway to Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks. The 42-mile-long valley between the Teton and Gros Ventre mountains includes the towns of Jackson, Teton Village, Kelly, Wilson, Moran, Moose and Hoback Junction. Home to Jackson Hole Mountain Resort, one of the top-rated ski and snowboard destinations in the world, Jackson Hole offers a host of winter activities including skiing and snowboarding, snowmobiling, showshoeing and more. Springtime gives way to rafting adventures, and during the summer, the area is known for its alpine hikes, mountain biking trails, epic wildlife viewing and more. In the fall, golden leaves illuminate the valley floor and jagged, snowcapped peaks provide views unlike anywhere else in the world. In town, cultural experiences abound, and the destination features several art galleries, historic playhouses and music venues. Jackson also offers a world-class dining scene and incredible boutique shopping.
- Access Anvil Hotel is easily accessible from Jackson Hole Airport (JAC), which provides a range of direct flight options from major airlines such as Alaska Airlines, American Airlines, Delta and United Airlines. The only commercial airport within national park boundaries, Jackson Hole Airport is located 9 miles from the town square, making it one of the most accessible airports in the Rockies. Jackson also has an excellent public bus system called START (Southern Teton Area Rapid Transit), which offers free bus rides within town and affordable rides out to Teton Village, south to Star Valley, or west to Teton Valley, Idaho.
- **History**In 1955, Harry and Irene Brown built The Anvil, an inn named in honor of Harry's old blacksmith shop on the same site. In late 2015, his history with the property dating back 20 years prior, entrepreneur Erik Warner purchased the property and is currently the lead partner in Anvil Hotel as well as the co-founder of Eagle Point Hotel Partners and Arbus Hospitality. Warner, with the intent to preserve its original spirit, assembled a team to renovate the motor lodge, including the Brooklyn-based Post Company (formerly Studio Tack), a group of designers, who were charged with living a full year in Jackson before the first nail was hammered; a collection of craftspeople to create, from the millwork on the walls right down to the blankets on beds; a group of hoteliers who were ready to act as the ultimate hosts, welcoming new arrivals, outdoor enthusiasts, and locals alike. The result is a hotel with a soul, a retreat that was born of a place, not just dropped into it.
